Please Note: Student films featuring animals on set require special approval from the course instructor and production advisor. They may require an additional free Animal Exhibit Permit from the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. To find out if an animal will need a permit, take a lookat NYC.gov's Article 161 for guidance.
